CHECK IT OUT-COLLECTION FOR C.O.T.S.

During this month of October a collection is taking place to supply the C.O.T.S. program with necessary supplies. COTS stands for Churches Offering Temporary Shelter. This overnight shelter happens at St. John the Evangelist School building in downtown Green Bay. The shelter is open November 1 through April 1. Numbers in **bold** correspond to items donated. Items requested include: gently used/new pillows/blankets (**18**), gently used/new socks of all sizes (**95 pair**), gently used/new long sleeve t-shirts (**21**), toilet paper (**26 rolls**), gently used/new washcloths, dishcloths and dishtowels (**104**), gently used/new twin size sheets (**78 sets**), winter hats (**6**), personal size personal hygiene items (**663**), new men's underwear (**38 pair**).
