### JAIL BIBLES

For the past few years International Bible Society (IBS) has provided Bibles to inmates at the Brown County Jail free of charge through a grant subscription program. IBS has recently discontinued this subscription program but the need for Bibles continues. Cost per Bible is \$5.00 or \$120.00 per case of 24 (English version) and \$4.00 or \$96.00 per case of 24 (Spanish version).
