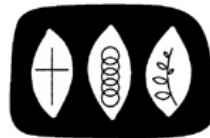

ADVANCING THE MISSION STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN
Advancing the Mission is an effort to strengthen five areas of diocesan ministry. These include fostering *Vibrant Parishes, Leadership Development, Evangelization, Life-long Education and Priestly Care*. Many persons have asked how the diocese will handle its portion of the funds raised in *Advancing the Mission*. You may recall the Lumen Christi Fund. In 1987, the Diocese of Green Bay conducted a campaign in which \$8 million was raised and put into an endowment for Catholic Education across the diocese. Since its beginning, the Lumen Christi fund has disbursed over \$9 million and has a current balance of over \$15 million. Because of the past success of the Lumen Christi Fund, the diocese is putting the funds raised for *Leadership Development, Evangelization, Life-long Learning and Priestly Care* into endowments. Just like the Lumen Christi Fund, this means that the funds will grow over time, be protected from use for other purposes, and provide long-term income for these important areas of ministry. My Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

The collection for World Mission Sunday is Sunday, October 21. This collection includes the Propagation of the Faith, the Collection for Latin America, and the Collection to Aid the Catholic Church in Central and Eastern Europe. It is an opportunity for us, as a local church, to share our faith with our sisters and brothers around the world who are in need of our tangible and generous outreach.

The collection for **The Propagation of the Faith** supports the work of the Church in Mission Dioceses around the world. Grants from the **Collection for Latin America** provide catechetical and lay leadership programs, youth ministry, evangelization projects, as well as formation programs for religious, priests, and deacons. The **Collection to Aid the Church in Central and Eastern Europe** supports seminarians, social service programs, youth ministry, pastoral centers, church restoration and spreading the Gospel message through the mass media.

Sixth Annual Father / Daughter Dance: Friday, October 19 at the Holy Family School Gym, 6:30-9:30pm.

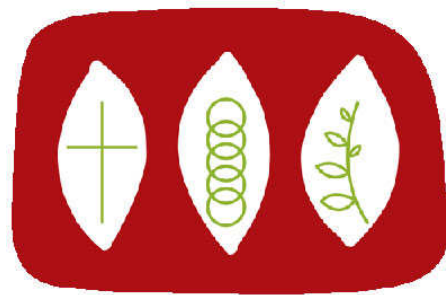
