Everyday Evangelizing

On this First Sunday of Lent, the responsorial psalm (Be merciful O Lord, for we have sinned.) helps us admit our human tendency to sin, as did Adam and Eve in the first reading. Psalm 51 also reminds us of Christ's redeeming goodness and compassion. Challenge yourself to memorize all or part of this Lenten theme song. Psalm 51: "Create In Me", #778 in our Breaking Bread Hymnal, could be used as our daily prayer during Lent.

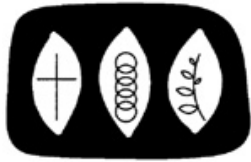

Faith Alive Progress: Faith Alive School System Initiative Progress: In order to strengthen the quality of Catholic school education for our children now and into the future, we are proceeding with legal incorporation of the system and the search for a system leader. Members of the Faith Alive Schools Steering Committee have been meeting with pastors, parish leaders and principals personally to brief them on the details of this project. Catholic school parents have already been notified in writing as to these necessary actions being taken. Meetings with parents and parishioners will follow, in April and May. As for the 2008-09 school year, very little, if any change should be evident to parents, students and staff at the eleven Green Bay area Catholic schools as a result of the formation of the school system. As the transition to the school system develops in the years ahead, thoughtful, gradual changes will be made, culminating in a complete school system in 2012-13.
