Collection for the World's Poor

The parishes of the Diocese of Green Bay will participate in the Collection for the World's Poor at Masses the weekend of March 1-2. This annual collection benefits three organizations - Peter's Pence, Catholic Relief Services, and the Catholic Campaign for Human Development.

Peter's Pence is the Holy Father's emergency relief fund. Since the end of the eighth century, Catholics throughout the world have been sending proceeds to the Holy Father for him to apply to emergency relief causes to benefit the world's poorest people. The Holy Father is particularly prone to apply these funds to natural disasters that strike the developing world.

Catholic Relief Services is the United States Catholic Church's international relief organization. It serves ninety-nine of the poorest countries in the world by providing disaster relief and medical, educational, social, and agricultural programming to the developing world. **CRS** depends on partnerships with locally born to run most their own local programs, after they have been trained by **CRS** staff.

Catholic Campaign for Human Development is the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops domestic poverty fighting arm. It provides funding to organizations led by low income people that increase the political and social status of poor people and/or increase the economic development of such persons. It is charged with helping to educate the non poor on the state of poverty in the U.S.A.

This collection will be taken next weekend after Communion. Envelopes were provided in your mailing packet and are also available on the tables by the exits of church.
