# Annual Report 2000-01

## A Note from the Principal

Dear Friends and Alumni,

Holy Family School is happy to present this Annual Report. We are grateful for the blessings of the 2000-01 school year.

Our theme, *Summoned to Serve*, was particularly lived by students in our middle school Service Program. This year, 35 students in 8th grade completed the program, logging 1,162 volunteer hours in home, church, school or community settings. The 7th graders earned 815 service hours, and the 6th graders recorded 1,102 volunteer hours.

2000-01 marked a milestone in the Service Program as our 8th graders were the first to voluntarily participate all three of their middle school years, thus, earning a service pin. Twenty-nine 8th graders (43%) were awarded a service pin.

Curriculum development included new math texts and manipulatives for grades K-8. A review established algebra as the course for all 8th graders and a pre-algebra transitional course for all 7th graders. A faculty curriculum study for English in grades 5-8 and social studies for grades 6 and 7 resulted in the purchase of new texts and materials for the 2001-02 school year.

To enhance our cultural learning, we had Ms. Miho Masuzawa, from Japan, with us for three months. Ms. Masuzawa shared her culture, dress, art and activities with the entire school. For two winter months, we hosted Valeria Meilla, a 13-year-old student from Panama, Central America. She studied with the 7th grade class. These cultural exchanges benefited us all!

An exciting professional opportunity for the teachers was to attend the National Catholic Education Association Convention in Mil-

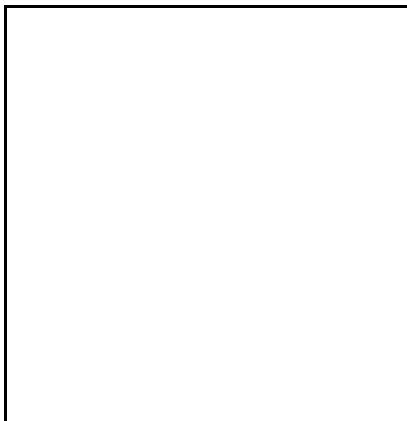

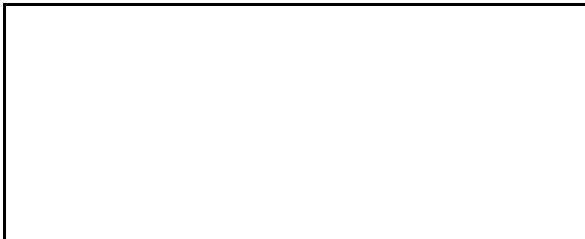
