Each year, goals for school improvement are implemented according to the school's current accreditation. Accreditation goals for the school board for 2000-2001 included:

- Increase communication concerning HFS with St. Agnes and St. Elizabeth Ann Seton parishioners.
- Seek ways to increase public relations regarding HFS with the greater Green Bay community.
- Create a development plan.
- Explore creative solutions for meeting the special needs of exceptional students enrolled at HFS.
- Explore offerings for French, German and/or Latin.
- Develop strategies to increase giving to the HFS Foundation.
- Hire personnel to address marketing and financial development areas.

Annual Campaign of Support — Thank You, Legacy Club Members!

We honestly didn't know what to expect with this first Annual Campaign of Support...and we are extremely touched by the support shown by our parishioners, parents and staff through their participation in the campaign.

We heartily thank each and every one of the donors listed for their generous contributions.

These donors are designated as charter members of our school's Legacy Club. Their donations will support the legacy of Catholic school education at HFS for many years to come.

Donations totaling \$14,180.50 were designated for current needs, as determined by the school's board of education.

With these funds, 30-year-old carpeting in the school's library/computer area was replaced and asbestos underneath was completely removed.

In addition, the front office was enhanced with modern, efficient office furniture, a first step in remodeling of that area.

Finally, current needs funds were designated toward the purchase of updated science textbooks and equipment.

Donations totaling \$1,837.50 were designated for future needs. These donations were added to the endowment funds overseen by the Holy Family School Foundation, Inc., established in 1994.

In addition, 33 donors selected to prayerfully support the school by becoming Prayer Partners.

The campaign began May 5 and concluded September 30, 2002. Next year's Annual Campaign of Support will begin in the spring.
