*You have enabled us to provide an educational experience that promotes growth in our Catholic faith, development of academic excellence, life with moral values, and an opportunity to serve within a Christian community for our Catholic youth. It happens because of you!*

*Our theme, Stewardship...A Way of Life, helped us to explore stewardship as a lifelong responsibility and privilege to care for all people and for all of creation. Our special emphases were prayer, service and sharing in our activities and events.*

*Our prayer activities were highlighted by a special remembrance service for September 11, a Respect Life Day, the Family Rosary prayed twice a month, weekly liturgies, daily prayer for Service men and women, and prayer outreach to our prayer partner*

*Catholic School, St. Mary School, Greenville.*

*Service activities included the middle school service program logging over 3,000 volunteer hours, rosary making for the military men and women, participation in the walk for Juvenile Diabetes Research, Cancer Walks, and work at Paul's Pantry.*

*The sharing projects were overwhelming. These projects included a food drive (570 items) and money collection (\$718) for an immediate need at St. Anthony Parish, Neopit and St. Michael Parish, Keshena; Thanksgiving and Christmas food and gift drives; Give-A-Kid-A-Book Campaign; support for one of our school families facing a tragedy; \$3,337 collected in a coin challenge; and nine crates of canned fruit and 250 pounds of peanut butter for the Kindness for Kids collection for St. Patrick's Pantry.*

*We were proud of our students' success in music competitions, forensic meets, spelling bee, state level competition in the National Geography Bee, Peace Poster contest, athletics, Knights of Columbus Knowledge contest, Respect Life Essay contests and Free Throw competition.*

HFS continued accreditation by the Wisconsin Nonpublic School Accrediting Association for the 2002-03 school year. ## Accreditation Goals 2002-03

Each year, goals for school improvement are implemented according to the school's current accreditation plan. Goals for 2002-03 included:

- Study the possible avenues of collaboration with St. Joseph School to provide quality Catholic education for all students of the three parishes.
- Include playground inspection repair and improvement in facility management planning.
- Budget for purchasing more playground equipment and keep existing items under repair.
- Include the experiences of students in religion formation which challenge their Christian values (i.e., TV music, movies, etc.).
- Incorporate creative methods on teaching religion. Rely less on textbooks by including more creative methods (video, journaling, student-generated skits).
- Continue efforts at integrating religion into various curricular areas.
- Investigate the possibility of supplying a back-up power source for the fire alarm/emergency lighting.
- Engage the buildings and grounds committee and the parish/school administration in the development and implementation of a 3-4 year capital plan for facilities.
- Establish an action plan for furniture replacement and the painting of the facilities.
- Investigate ways to dehumidify the library areas.

## Number of Annual Campaign of Support Donors Increases

*The support for our school's legacy of quality Catholic education is growing!! We are grateful to this year's donors, which double in number that of last year's annual campaign. Thank you for your support!!!*

*Contributions totaled \$17,215. Of that number \$14,190, or 82% were designated for current needs which included modern science textbooks and materials, computer technology upgrades and replacement flooring in second level classrooms.*

*Donations of \$3,025, or 18%, were designated for future needs. These donations were added to the endowment fund overseen by the Holy Family School Foundation, Inc. The HFS Foundation, established in 1994, has given over \$13,000 in tuition scholarships in recent years.*

*In addition, 27 donors agreed to prayerfully support the school by becoming Prayer Partners.*
